NINE BALLOONS ENTERED FOR RACE FOR GORDON BENNETT CUP IN OCTOBER

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 11.—Entries have been closed for the James Gordon Bennett international balloon race, which will start from Kansas City, October 5. Nine balloons are entered, the pick of three nations ranking highest in the ballooning game.

The contestants will be—The United States, Lieut. Frank P. Lahm, Captain John Berry and William Assman of St. Louis; Germany, Lieut. Vogle, Ingenieur Gerick and Freiherr Von Pohl; France, Emile Dubonna, Alfred Leblanc and Welby Jourdan.

Two balloons have been entered to contest for the Lahm cup, which may be won by any balloon establishing a new record in the United States. The balloons in this contest will be the Kansas City II., piloted by Captain E. H. Honeywell, and the Topeka II.
