Daly is Well and Truly Christened;

Pilot For Grain Ship Here; Salvage Princess Remaining in Vancouver.

Christening of the Daly, formerly the Alaskan cannery tender Slaven, latest acquisition to the service fleet of the Armour Salvage Co. here, took place last evening at the company floats. The christening was performed by W. H. Daly, father of Mrs. W. P. Armour, wife of the head of the company, with the time-honored custom of breaking a ribbon-bedecked bottle of champagne over the bow. There were about thirty persons present, the party adjourning to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Armour where the toast to the Daly was duly and ably proposed by Mr. Daly after whom the vessel has been re-named. Among those present and taking part in the ceremonies was W. J. Asseistine, M. L. A. for Atlin.

With thirty-five passengers on board, C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah, with Capt. Thomas Cliff in command in place of Capt. William Palmer, who is on vacation, was in port yesterday morning from 9 to 10 o'clock on her regular fortnightly voyage from Vancouver to Skagway and other Alaska points. No passengers disembarked from the vessel here, three leaving here aboard her for the north.

With a fair sized list of passengers. Union steamer Catala, Capt. James Findlay, arrived in port at 7:45 o'clock last evening from the south and sailed a couple of hours later for Anyox. Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here tomorrow morning and sail at 1:30 p.m. for Vancouver and wayports.

Joseph Flood arrived in the city on the Catala last evening from Vancouver to act as pilot for the British steamer Vancouver City which is due here this week to load a full cargo of grain from the Alberta Wheat Pool's local elevator for the United Kingdom or Continent. Capt. Flood was formerly well known here as an officer of Canadian National Steamships.
