## TALKING OF ELECTIONS

Skeena Fight Between Hanson and Orme—Different in Cariboo

**SMITHERS, June 25**—Interest in the forthcoming federal election campaign is beginning to develop in the central interior. The consensus of opinion at this early date appears to be that, as far as Skeena is concerned, the fight will be between Olof Hanson M.P., Liberal candidate, and C. H. Orme, the Conservative, both of whom are well known and popular personally. C. C. F. enthusiasm is declared to be merely superficial and already on the wane. There is even talk of movements to change the nominee from J. E. Panter, local railwayman, who was chosen candidate months ago at a convention in Prince Rupert.

Much different is the situation in Cariboo, which includes such centres as Vanderhoof and Prince George. There John McInnis of Prince George, widely known and highly popular personally, is conceded a good chance to win over John A. Fraser M.P., the Conservative, and J. G. Turgeon of Vanderhoof, the Liberal. "If any C. C. F. wins in Canada, it will be John McInnis in Cariboo," is a statement that is often heard.
