Trade Treaty With United States is Under Arrangement

OTTAWA, September 7 (Canadian Press)— Canada should not become involved in any foreign war in which there is no aggression of Canadian rights, declared Premier R. B. Bennett in a nation-wide radio address last night in opening his election campaign. He would consider it the duty of any government he headed to keep Canada out of such a war. In peace and war,
