Miss Jean Harrison R.N., lady superintendent, reported to the hospital board at its meeting last night that the institution was fairly busy at this time. General routine was going along nicely and preparations for observance of Christmas were under way.

A letter from the provincial secretary's office, read at last night's meeting of the hospital board, requested a list of names of all members of the board so that each might be kept in touch with developments as they came in connection with the matter of health insurance legislation.

The regular monthly meeting of the board of directors of the Prince Rupert General Hospital was held last night at the hospital. Those present were: S. D. Macdonald, president; W. M. Brown, Frank Dibb, G. P. Tinker and G. V. Wilkinson, directors; H. W. Birch, managing secretary, and Miss Jean Harrison R.N., lady superintendent.

The hospital board, at its meeting last night, decided to send a letter to the Prince Rupert Gyro Club warmly expressing appreciation of the club's action in deciding to go ahead with the complete furnishing of a hospital ward. Furniture for the ward is expected to arrive at any time and will be immediately installed.

Reporting at the regular monthly meeting of the hospital board last night, Frank Dibb, chairman of the house committee, stated that an examination of the roof of the hospital building had been made by J. G. Steen who had given an outside estimate of \$40 on work necessary to stop leaks which have developed during recent heavy rainfalls. Subject to approval of the rest of the committee, it was proposed to have the work done as soon as weather permitted.

Communications at last night's meeting of the hospital board from the Prince Rupert Trades & Labor Council, Prince Rupert Liberal Association, Prince Rupert Gyro Club, Canadian Legion and Junior Section of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce announced that each of these organizations had endorsed the move to have the provincial government lend financial support to the project of establishing a new fireproof hospital building here.


