HIGH COST OF LIVING

Six People Killed in Vienna Bread Riots

(Canadian Press Despatch)
Vienna, Sept. 19.—The city is quiet today after a turbulent Sunday, when scores of people were injured in riots fanned by the Socialists against the higher cost of living. One report says that six persons were killed and two hundred injured during the rioting.

No Tenders for Loan

Montreal, Sept. 19.—(Special)—For the first time in the history of the city no tenders have been received for a civic loan. The city called for tenders for a loan of seven millions and no one responded. The officials are of opinion that the cause is to be found in the unsettled financial conditions of the world. It has never happened before.

STRIKE IN IRELAND

Railways Tied Up and Troops Held in Readiness

(Canadian Press Despatch)
Dublin, Sept. 19.—A general strike has been declared on all the railways. Troops are being held in readiness. The strike will interfere greatly with trans-Atlantic traffic.

Tonroto, Sept. 19.—(Special)—The safe arrival at Churg King, China, of a number of missionaries from the suite infected provinces is reported. There are still several hundreds to be accounted for. The Chinese government is rushing troops forward.

Los Angeles, Sept. 19.—(Special)—Immense tanks of oil have been destroyed and firemen are fighting desperately to save the plant of the Hercules Oil Company here. The loss is already over half a million.
