WHY WAIT LONGER?

Hon. H. H. Stevens suggests that if Premier Bennett will implement some of his proposed remedial legislation at the coming session of Parliament it will receive his full support. That seems to be a reasonable stand. Why wait? Have we not waited four years with nothing done?

One Prince Rupert merchant, in giving his opinion of the Premier's election announcements, remarked that Mr. Bennett must think we are all a lot of children to sit back all this time and do nothing and then lay his bait just before election time.

Of course Mr. Bennett has a right to change his mind. No one objects to that. We are glad to see him recognize the need of a change of policy but we do not think he can expect the support of the people of the country providing they have something better to support. Much will depend upon the stand taken by Mackenzie King. His lieutenants have spoken already. Captain Ian McKenzie of Vancouver, who undoubtedly will be a member of the new Liberal ministry, has openly espoused a change of policy that is designed to provide work and wages for the people of the country. He is with Premier Pattullo in that regard. It is said unofficially that the policy of the Liberals will be a radical one, but it must be officially announced and backed by the leader of the party in order to become valid. The use of the public credit for work and wages is a definite objective. Let us hear from Mr. King in regard to it.

ARE TO BE SHOT

It is announced in a dispatch from Moscow that the person or persons responsible for a recent railway accident will be shot. Excuses will not be taken. It sounds ruthless but it may be effective. Carelessness is a capital offense in that country and is punished accordingly.

CAMPAIGNING FOR JOBS


