The vicar presented his annual statement in which he reviewed the progress made during the year and conveyed his thanks to the various helpers.

George Dover submitted the financial statement and Mrs. A. Head the report of the Woman's Auxiliary, both of which were accepted. It was stated that the debt on the Church Hall had been reduced to a very small figure which it was hoped would be cleared off in a short time.

George Dover was reappointed people's warden and H. Halliwell was nominated by the vicar as his warden, Sidesmen chosen were A. Attree, J. Sparkes, W. Donald and R. Cory. Mr. Dover was given charge of the envelope fund and was also elected representative to the synod.

WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

With a fair sized list of passengers, C. N. R. steamer Prince George, Capt. H. E. Nedden, arrived in port at 10:30 this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and will sail at 4 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart whence she will return here this evening southbound.

The Seattle halibut schooner Paragon, under charter to the International Fisheries Commission for research work on the halibut banks, arrived in port yesterday afternoon from Queen Charlotte Island waters where for the past four weeks she has been engaged in dragging for halibut larvae. The vessel is here to outfit for another voyage and will probably leave overnight. John L. Kask is in charge of the scientific party aboard the Paragon.

Imperial Oil Co.'s tanker Imperial arrived in port at 7 o'clock this morning from Ioco with a cargo of fuel for the company's local tanks. After discharging, the Imperial will sail on her return south.

Thomas Loudon, superintendent of Canadian National Steamships, arrived in the city on the Prince George this morning from Vancouver, being here in connection with the overhaul of the steamer Prince Rupert at the local dry dock. Mr. Loudon will be returning south on the same steamer tomorrow night.
