In the Canadian National Exhibition meet she bettered the world record for 100 yards with a time of 10.6 seconds. In the national A. A. U., as well as in an exhibition race at the Missouri Valley district meet, she was timed in 11.6 for 100 metres. The accepted world record, held by Miss Walsh, is 11.8.

Miss Stephens herself is at loss to account for her athletic ability. She is an exceptionally tall girlfive feet, 11 inches — and she give her a seven-foot six-inch stride. In action she has the grace of an antelope. Her stride is effortless, and combines all the elements of perfect sprinting form. As a matter of fact, her technique can be traced to Brutus Hamilton, University of California track coach. 


