## Canon Rushbrook Talks to Members Of Local Lodge

Presenting in an interesting light some local experiences which might in the ordinary course of events be considered quite commonplace, Rev. Canon W. F. Rushbrook, rector of St. Peter's Anglican Church, addressed the local Oddfellows' Lodge at a gathering which followed the regular lodge meeting last night. One of the things he described was a trip to the North Island fishing grounds. Refreshments were served.

The local lodge has been imbued with new enthusiasm following the official visit here last week of the provincial Grand Master, George J. Scott, fruit rancher from Oyama in the Okanagan district. The principal feature in connection with Mr. Scott's visit here was an inspiring address along practical and up-to-date lines which he delivered before the members of the lodge. He alluded to the progress which the order continued to make despite trying times and made some practical suggestions as to how fraternal organizations might assist in community betterment and general service. He drew attention to conditions around Fernie and Corbin in the Crow's Nest Pass country where things were quite difficult owing to strikes, lack of work, etc. One of Mr. Scott's suggestions was that the fraternal orders might throw their halls open as community centres for the discussion of public problems and as a venue for the clean activities of youth with time on their hands.

During his stay here a dinner was tendered to Mr. Scott at the Knox Hotel. Mrs. Scott, who accompanied him, was entertained by the Rebekahs.

Completing a regular voyage from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands, C. N. R. steamer Prince John, Capt. ## DRAMATIC BILL HERE

Thrills in "Murder in the Clouds"  
—Poignancy in "The Flame Within"

"Murder in the Clouds," an exciting melodramatic mystery of the air, and "The Flame Within," the gripping story of a woman doctor, are the features of a mid-week double bill program being presented at the Capitol Theatre.

"Murder in the Clouds," with a cast headed by Lyle Talbot, Ann Dvorak and Gordon Westcott, the last-mentioned of whom was killed a few days ago at Hollywood as a result of an accident while playing polo, concerns a plot of international conspirators to steal a secret formula for high explosives from the government. Spies plan to blow up a plane in which the formula is to be shipped and this leads to a thrilling hunt for the air robbers with airplane battles. There is also a stirring romance in which two air pilots battle for the love of a girl. Her kidnapping leads to a crashing climax.

Ann Harding and Herbert Marshall make a good romantic team in "The Flame Within." Miss Harding is seen as a noted woman psychiatrist who devotes her life to untangling the mental disturbances of others. Marshall is a solid, reliable doctor of great charm. Maureen O'Sullivan and Henry Stephenson are also prominent members of the cast.

## Kipling Elusive Seldom Observed

Famous English Poet Believed Well But Subject To Many Rumours

LONDON, Nov. 20: (AP)—Rudyard Kipling, the veteran bard, is gaining a reputation, second only to Sir Basil Zaharoff, for elusiveness of movement and personal inaccessibility.

Only Zaharoff, the international banker and philanthropist whose contact with the general public is only through an obscure bit of news in the daily press on rare occasions, can top the author of "Barrack Room Ballads" for an almost shy

withdrawal from the public eye. Now 70 years old, Kipling and his life and habits are becoming a vague quantity to the England which loves him. Kipling, in fact, seems to the average Englishman, part and parcel of the folklore of his native country.

Scarcely a week passes without some fresh rumor about the sage of Burwash. Most of them are due to the fact that Kipling lives the life of a recluse at his Sussex estate, which is not equipped with a telephone, considered by anyone other than those with the Kipling cast of mind as an indispensable adjunct of easy, if not modern, living.

A check of police authorities at Marionbad, Czechoslovakia, developed the information that Kipling was not at that resort seriously ill,

as had been reported in some sections of the American press. It was learned he had been there about a month ago, however, "feeling seedy." Since then, members of the local Kipling Society have glimpsed the Bombay-born member of the British aristocracy of letters several times, hurrying along London streets "looking exceptionally chipper." They are sure their idol is working hard on another epic at Burwash.
