Doubts If Sheba Was in Ethiopia

TORONTO, Nov. 20: (CP)—A ring of beaten gold presented to him by the Emperor of Abyssinia himself, is worn by Dr. S. A. Mercer, professor of Egyptology and Semitic Languages at the University of Toronto.
 Dr. Mercer did not believe that the ancient treasure trove of the Queen of Sheba was an object of the Italian invasion.
 "The Queen of Sheba was never in Ethiopia," he said. "Ethiopia used to be called the land of Kush and it was there that Egypt got all its gold—there is lots of gold in Ethiopia still. The Italians may have discovered the remains of some of the old gold mines worked by the Egyptians."

LONDON, Nov. 20: (CP)—Special attention is being devoted by London County Council to the health of 500,000 children in its elementary schools and recently the council decided to introduce a scheme for the systematic weighing and measuring of all those under 12 years of age.
 The children's jubilee festival was held recently at the Royal Albert Hall and illustrated the leading achievements of the present generation of L. C. C. children in music and dancing. There was a choir of 1600 children, an orchestra of 200 instrumentalists and a brass band. Folk dancing and classical dancing were carried out by 200 scholars of all ages.
