## Suffragists in States

A strong demonstrative suffragists and suffragettes, and not

They pleaded long and vigorously, each of them, but it remained for Governor Shafroth of Colorado to furnish the climax of the meeting by declaring that three of his fellow-speakers, Governor Hawley of Idaho; Governor Spry, of Utah, and Governor Dey of Washington, "didn't know what they were talking about" when they condemned the campaigns of the militant suffragists.

J. C. Watters of Victoria, was elected president of the Dominion Trades Congress at Calgary by a majority of thirty. The vice presidency went to Bancroft. The congress voted down the proposal to form a Canadian labor party. It was decided to hold the next annual convention at Guelph.
