Bringing north a good sized list of passengers, Union steamer Catala, Capt. A. E. Dickson, arrived in port at 8:30 last evening from the south and sailed a couple of hours later for Anyox, Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here tomorrow morning and sail at 1:30 p.m. for Vancouver and waypoints.

Capt. W. W. Mounce, after an absence of a few months, has returned to his duties as pilot of the steamer Catala on the present voyage north. He was ashore for several weeks in Vancouver on annual vacation but more recently has been in command of the company's motorship Comox on the West Howe Sound route.

The Ketchikan motorship freighter Evelyn Berg arrived in port at 10:30 this morning from Ketchikan with two carloads of halibut for transshipment east over the Canadian National Railways. After discharging, the vessel sailed at 1 o'clock this afternoon. In command of the Evelyn Berg is Capt. 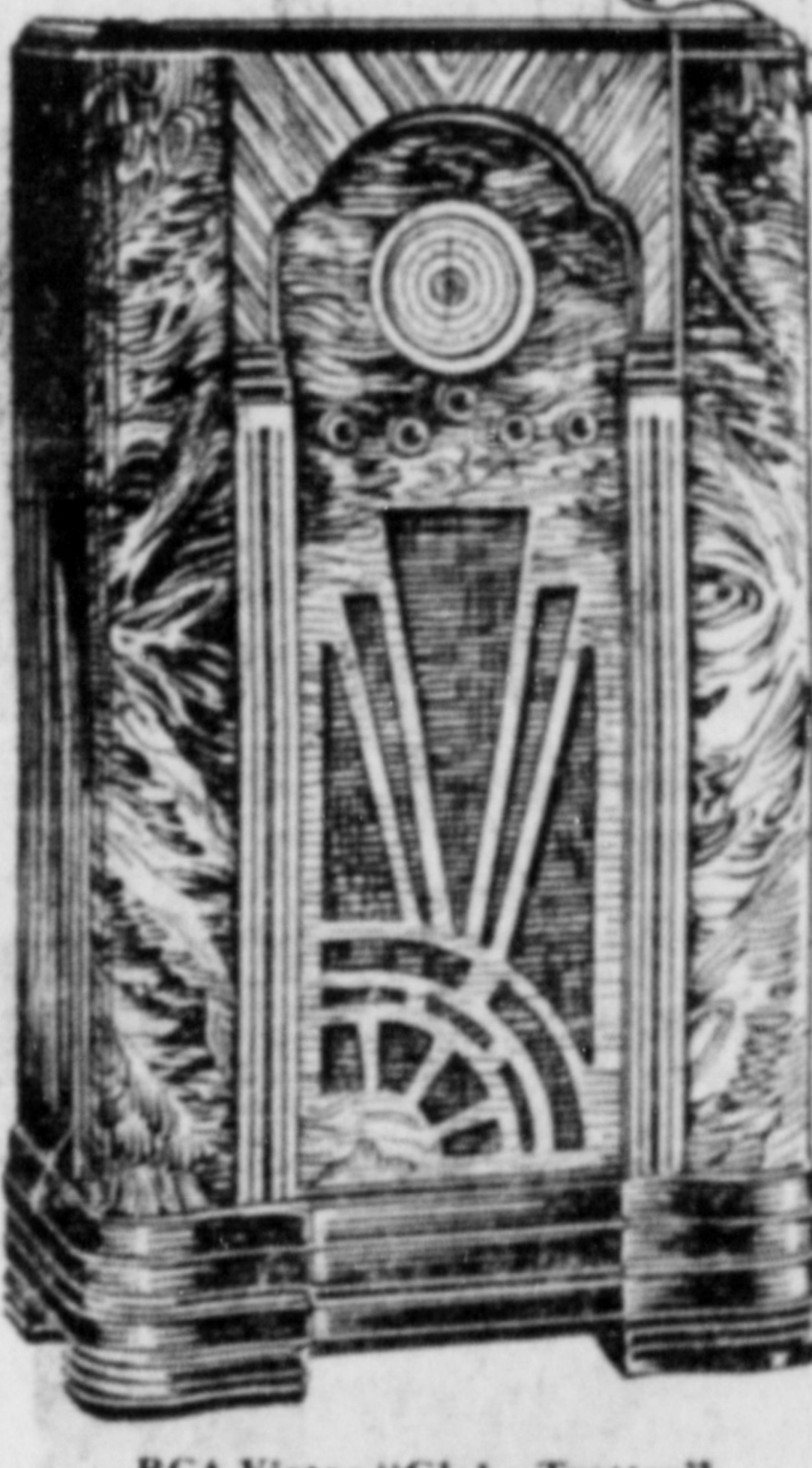
