

JOE BAYLEY TRAINING TO MEET OSCAR NELSON

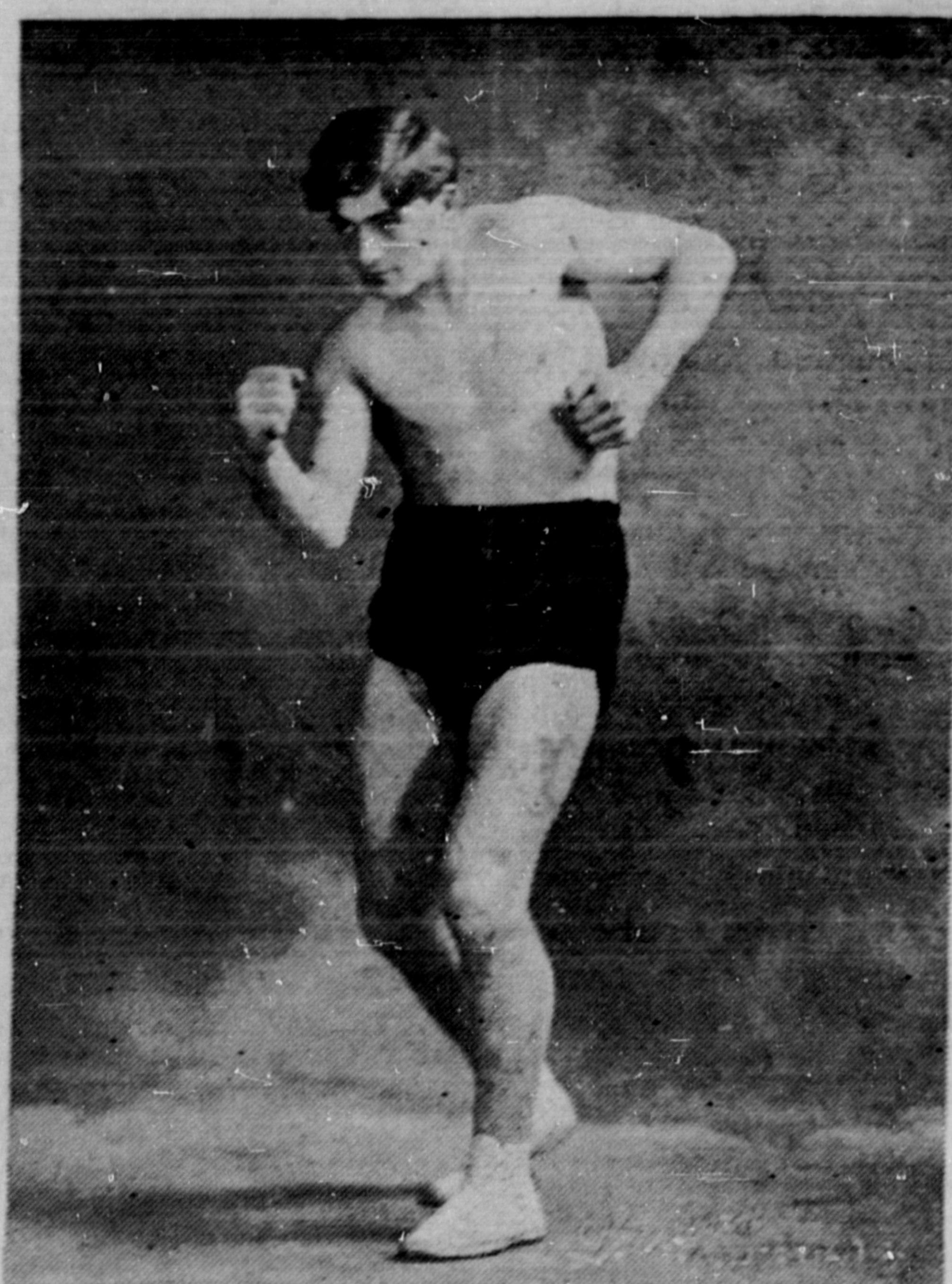

ELECTION ENDS WITH A TRAGEDY

In a Political Quarrel at Campbellton, N. B., Dr. Doherty Inadvertently Stabs and Kills Mr. D. J. Bruce With an Umbrella.

(Canadian Press Despatch) Campbellton, N. B., Sept. 24.—A sad election tragedy has plunged this little town in mourning. One of its most respected citizens, D. J. Bruce is lying dead, and another respected citizen, Dr. W. W. Doherty is in jail charged with causing his death.

The tragedy followed a heated election argument between the two men, the dead man being a Conservative and the doctor a Liberal. During the argument, one or other of the men lost his temper and blows were exchanged. The doctor struck Mr. Bruce with his umbrella in the face, the steel point entering Mr. Bruce's eye, destroying the sight, and causing his death a few hours later.

The affair has caused a great sensation. Dr. Doherty was placed under arrest and now awaits trial on a charge of causing the death of Mr. Bruce.

Phenomenally Low Levels Recorded for This Time of Year, and Very Early Close of River Traffic Predicted Unless Change Occurs.

A phenomenally low state of the water exists today, and worse is threatened. If things go on like this for only a few days more it is certain that there will be an unusually early close of the river navigation, and corresponding difficult conditions up river owing to the problem of getting in supplies. There are people in Prince Rupert this morning who are positively praying for more water in the Skeena, and the first thing done in the morning is to scan that little yellow bulletin in Foley, Welch & Stewart's office that tells what the water is doing.
