Sunshine in Prince Rupert this September totalled 100.8 hours as compared with 101.4 hours in the same month last year, bringing the total of sunshine for the year to date to 922.3 hours as against 929.4 hours in the corresponding period of last year. Precipitation this September amounted to 6.2 inches as compared with 9.85 inches in September 1934, making total precipitation for this year to date 34.02 inches in comparison with last year's 69.94 inches at a corresponding date.

The weather summary for September this year, as announced today by R. G. Emmerson, Digby Island, Dominion meteorologist, is as follows:
