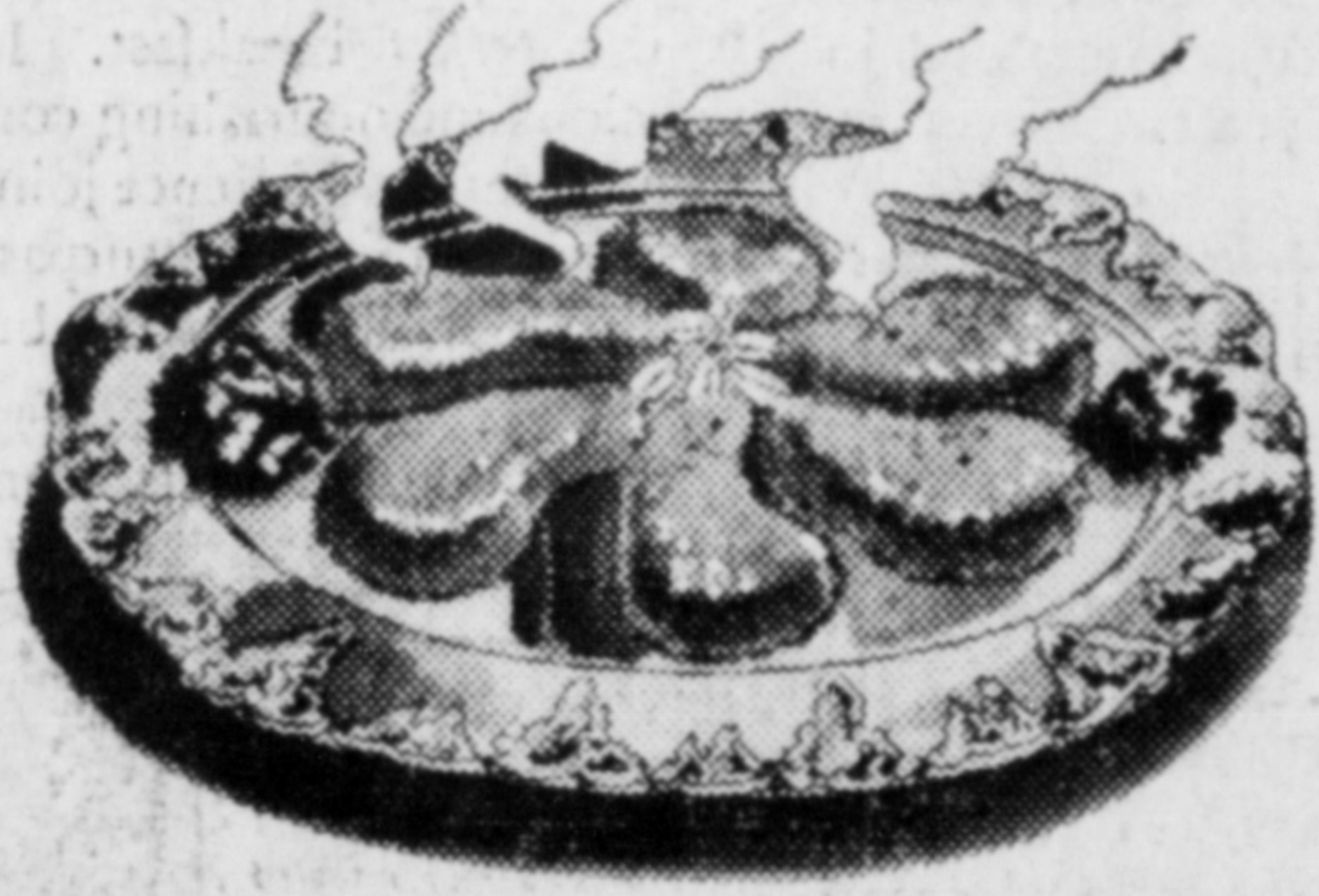

★ Lobster Chops

2 tsp. butter 2 tsp. flour Pepper 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 cup Nestlé's Evaporated Milk diluted with 1/4 cup water 1 cup lobster cut in small pieces Few drops onion juice Fine bread crumbs Dash cayenne Nestlé's Evaporated Milk
