## SPORT CHAT

Those interested in the game of basketball in Prince Rupert will regret the retirement of J. Percy Page, the wonderful coach of the famous "Edmonton Commercial Grads", which team, with Mr. Page visited here some years ago. The team was organized during the school year of 1914-1915 among the graduate students of the Commercial High School, and during the spring the team won the first official Alberta championship, and with the single exception of one year (1920), has held it continuously since that time. In 1922 the "Grads" went to Ontario, and played the London "Shamrocks" in the first official Canadian Championship series, defeating the London girls decisively by 20 points. Except for two years, when the play offs were abandoned, the "Grads" have won every Canadian championship series; twelve in all.

In 1923 the "Grads" met the famous Cleveland "Favorite-Knits" champions of the United States, in a two-game series, and defeated the American opponents in both games. The "Grads" were awarded the Underwood International Trophy at that time, and have never been defeated in defence of it.

During the twenty years of the team's history, with a constantly changing personnel, the "Grads" have played 421 official and exhibition games, all over the world, and won 409 of these games. Two of the twelve losses were against men's teams. On one occasion the Grads ran up a string of 78 consecutive wins, and have at different times gone through an entire season without a loss.

The retiring captain, Margaret MacBurney, holds what are believed to be two world's records. Over a period of ten years, she has played in 171 games, scoring 12.1 pts. per game. On an official test in 1931, she scored 61 consecutive baskets from the free-throw mark.
