Some Broken Pledges of The Great Promiser UNEMPLOYMENT Mr. Bennett in Victoria, June 17th, 1930, at the last election:

"We in Canada cannot tolerate a dole. Men and women in this country want work, not charity. There are great natural undertakings that this country should engage in right now. And we must have employment for every man and woman in the country who is able to work and wants to work. You have my promise that if the Conservative party is returned to power as soon after July 28th as possible Parliament will be called together to deal with the problem of unemployment by providing not doles, but work."
