

Last week in closing the debate on the budget Premier T. D. Pattullo emphasized that there must be a new deal for the province from Ottawa and that, as soon as the policy of the federal government towards the province was changed, the provincial government would be in a position to relieve the municipalities of some of their burden.

While disclaiming that he was suggesting secession, the Premier was very emphatic in regard to the position of British Columbia. He said:

"So far as this province is concerned, it cannot continue under a policy which, through tariff and freight rates, strangles its economic welfare, nor can we permit unchallenged the invasion of provincial sources of revenue and there must be a redefinition of authority in respect to revenue resources."

Mr. Pattullo also refers to the fact that, while this province would like to do many things, the provincial government, is not a sovereign power, in that its acts are liable to be vetoed by the Dominion government. If it had been a sovereign power with the customs and other revenues which would come to it as such there would have been no difficulty in financing. He was still urging the use of the national credit to provide work and wages for the unemployed and the taking over of the P. G. E. by the federal government.
