LIQUORITES IN CONTROL

So Hears United Church Conference in Convention Session At Vancouver

VANCOUVER, May 20: (CP)-Repeated charges that liquor interests in British Columbia have donated large amounts of money to the political parties and suggestions that bootleggers were practically immune from arrest featured sessions of the United Church Conference Saturday.

R. G. Howell of Victoria declared that members of the Legislature had been "bought" by the liquor interests. He claimed that \$60,000 had been given to party funds by liquor iconcerns.

Case Thrown Out Of Supreme Court

Sam Deschamps Loses in Action Against Portland Canal Utilities Companies

Mr. Justice Denis Murphy, in Supreme Court Saturday afternoon, dismissed the case in which Samuel Deschamps of Stewart sued the International Electric Co., E. R. Workman and Northern B. C Power Co. for \$20,000 on the grounds of breach of agreement whereby plaintiff was wrongfully deprived of his interest in certain water rights and undertakings on American Creek in the Portland Canal district.
