Anthony Eden and observers believed that the appointment foreshadowed steadfast support by Great Britain of the League of Nations. The appointment was announced yesterday and caused little surprise. International reaction appears to be satisfactory except in the case of Italy, officialdom of which is inclined to take it as a gesture not sympathetic to Italy.

Satisfactory consultations have been concluded, it was learned today, between British and French general staffs involving mutual support by armies and navies of both countries in case of an attack of Italian desperation. It was impossible to learn whether French and British air forces were considered in the talks concerning mutual assistance which were iniliated some time ago.


