TAX MAIL ORDER HOUSES

Local merchants pay local taxes, spend their money in the city and help to provide employment for local boys and girls. The big mail order stores bleed the small cities white and give absolutely nothing in return. Local boys never get a chance of a job in the big mail order houses and if they did it would be refused because the pay is so low. Local merchants pay current rates for wages and help young men and young women of the city to carry on away for their needs instead of buying in Prince Rupert and thus help their neighbors to live and their neighbors' children to obtain employment.

If a peddler comes to town he has to pay a large licence fee. We think the law should compel the big mail order houses to pay a licence fee before it can flood the city with catalogues in order to entrap the citizens into buying from them. If this were done there would be little mail order buying in Prince Rupert, merchants would be able to carry larger and better stocks and sell at lower prices. Everyone would benefit.

AN IMPORTANT DECISION

The decision of the management of the Canadian National Railways to change the old foundation site of the once planned railway hotel from an unsightly hole into a beautiful sunken garden is a very important step in the development of Prince Rupert. Once it is improved it will be a great tourist attraction and will vie with the sunken garden being constructed by the provincial government at the back of the court house in public interest.

It is understood that General Manager Warren has the wholehearted support of the local railway staff in his plan to beautify the place and that under the management of Superintendent Tobey the city may expect a worthy transformation of the spot. The city is to be congratulated on the decision of the officials.

- (1) Employers, respecting salaries and wages paid to employees during the calendar year 1934.
- (2) Every person in receipt of salary, wages, or investment income.

These Returns are required to be filed not later than

FEBRUARY 28th, 1935

Taxpayers should obtain forms from any Provincial Government office or chartered bank in the Province.

An urgent request is made for these Returns to be filed as much in advance of the final date as possible to enable the Department to give better service to taxpayers than can be provided during the rush of the last day.

Corporation, business, or professional income is required to be returned within three months after the end of the taxpayer's fiscal year.
