

UNITED STATES OF THE WORLD

The world is gradually getting together in spite of the various setbacks that seem to occur from time to time. The first movement toward united effort took place prior to the Russo-Japanese war when the Czar of Russia called the first conference of nations. Various conferences have taken place since that time and every year sees a greater interest taken in international affairs. The present move of the League of Nations to try to prevent the war in Ethiopia, feeble as it may seem, is a move in the right direction. It is educating the nations to the idea that safety lies in union. All this is gradually leading up to a time when the world will be bound by a strong tie such as a world federation of nations. In the meantime, we have to keep moving along lines calculated to make the peoples of Sweden and United the world conscious of the need of some such federation Sweden and United or union, this taking the place of defensive alliances. Possibly when the time for such a union arrives the world will be ready to arrange for a fiscal union.


