THE CANADIAN PRESS

The Canadian Press, of which organization the Daily News is a member, last year expended nearly \$700,000 in the collection and transmission of news to its member papers and, in addition, supplied free of cost radio news broadcasts of the highlights of the news to many radio stations. The cost of collecting the returns from the Dominion election was between seven and eight thousand dollars. The cable and east and west long distance telegraphing was done by means of the new printer instruments which require no hand work in the sending or receiving. All important Canadian newspapers are members of the Canadian Press.

MAKING BUILDINGS PAY

It is to be hoped that conditions will change to such an extent in Prince Rupert that it will not be necessary to carry out the suggestion of the Commissioner that buildings may have to be taxed higher than at present in order to make up for the lowering of the assessments following the judgment in the Prudhomme case.

It is possible that Mr. Justice McDonald may hand down a written judgment which will state whether he considers assessments generally too high in Prince Rupert. At any rate he remarked in court that his decision in this case need not necessarily affect other properties.

Evidently most people seem to agree with the judge that the Prudhomme lots are not worth more than \$750 each and it has been suggested that assessments on Third Avenue are comparatively lower than they are on Fraser Street, even since the revision.

All this will be a matter for the assessor to consider this year in order that he may revise his assessment at the beginning of 1937. If the pulp mill should come, the assessments, it is to be presumed, will not be questioned.

WALES WINS RUGBY GAME

Captured International Honors By Three to Nil Victory—Riotous Scenes at Cardiff Arms

CARDIFF, Wales, March 14: (CP)—Wales clinched international rugby honors today by defeating Ireland three to nothing in a keenly fought game before a capacity crowd of sixty thousand fans at Cardiff Arms Park.

Riotous scenes preceded the start of the game as thousands stormed the gates in an effort to enter the grounds which were already filled to capacity. Four were trampled and sent to hospital in a rush that followed. Firemen dispersed the crowd by turning streams of water on them.
