Timely Recipes

APRICOTS FOR IRON

Apricots, besides being "good for you" because of their high mineral content, are attractive and appetizing. The cleverest chef could not make a better looking, more flavoursome dessert than Apricot Meringue Tapioca yet the newest cook can make a perfect dish by following this simple recipe.

Apricot Meringue Tapioca

4 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca, 4 tablespoons sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 2 egg yolks, 2 cups milk, 1 teaspoon lemon juice, 1/4 teaspoon grated lemon rind, 1 cup sliced canned apricots, drained, 2 egg whites, 4 tablespoons sugar.

Combine tapioca, sugar, salt, egg yolks, and milk in top of double boiler and stir enough to break egg yolks. Place over rapidly boiling water, bring to scalding point (allow 3 to 5 minutes) and cook 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Add lemon juice and rind. Turn into greased baking dish. Cover with apricots. Beat egg whites until foamy; add sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating after each addition until sugar is thoroughly blended. After sugar is added, continue beating until mixture will stand in peaks. Pile high on pudding and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 15 minutes, or until delicately brown. Serves 6.

British-Israel Names Officers

P. H. Linzey Re-elected President
 And Mrs. Jessie Jacobs, Is Secretary-Treasurer

P. H. Linzey was re-elected president of the local branch of the British Israel Society at the annual meeting last night. Sam Massey was re-elected vice-president and Mrs. Jessie Jacobs, secretary-treasurer. The executive consists of Dr. W. C. Aspinall, M. M. McLachlan and Robert Bartlett.

Dr. Aspinall was the speaker last night. Dr. Aspinall reviewed one of his previous addresses on "A Little Bit of Leaven" from Matthew XIII. He traced the power of the spoken word in the Isles of the West and its return to Rome, thence to all parts of the world.

The speaker took his hearers back to the time of Caradoc, the only ruler to enter Rome as a prisoner, conquered and in chains, to be given his parole and allowed to live as a free man with full enjoyment of the revenues of his royal Ilurian domains forwarded to him by his subjects and council, a striking example of Divine intervention. Thus the word might be spread over all the earth. The hardships suffered by those bearing the message were touched on by Dr. Aspinall.

Interesting extracts also from H. V. Morton's book "In the Steps of the Master" were also read, illustrating how evidences have been left behind to guide the enquirer in his study of the Divine plan and showing that "God is working his purpose out as year succeeds to year."

A general discussion followed in which many took part.

WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

With two carloads of frozen fish for transshipment east over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s motorship Norco, Capt. Ekholm, arrived in port at 8:30 this morning from Ketchikan and, after discharging, sailed in continuation of her voyage to Seattle. The Norco is now on the run in place of the company's steamer North Sea which has been tied up at Seattle for the winter.

MUCH FISH IS LANDED

Salmon Most Important Product Of This District With Halibut Second

A total of 809,647 hundred-weight of salmon was landed in Prince Rupert district during the year 1935, the total value being \$2,819,920, according to a statement by James Boyd, district supervisor of fisheries. Halibut was the second fisheries product in importance amounting to 144,851 hundred-weight and a total value of \$891,053. Next in value were halibut livers to the amount of 2,653 hundred-weight with a value of \$108,052.
