TERRACE FUNERAL

Entire Community Honors Miss Margaret Kenney in Death

TERRACE, Oct. 5: (Will Robinson)—One of the largest gatherings of mourners in the history of Terrace met at Knox United Church on Saturday afternoon to pay final tribute to the memory of Miss Margaret Leila Kenney, daughter of E. T. Kenney, M. L. A. for Skeena, and Mrs. Kenney.

After an illness of some weeks Miss Kenney passed away at the Prince Rupert General Hospital on Thursday night. Accompanied by the parents, the body was brought home to Terrace and the funeral services were conducted by Rev. Adam Crisp of the United Church and Rev. A. Hinchcliffe of the Anglican Church. The church was crowded to capacity and many of the mourners could not find seats. Practically the whole community attended. Hymns loved by Margaret were sung, these being "When He Cometh" and "O Love That Will Not Let Me Go." A. Hewson was organist.

Rev. A. Hinchcliffe read the lesson and Rev. Adam Crisp gave a very fitting address.

A number of classmates of the deceased handled the flowers following the ceremony at the church. This group included Mrs. P. Gibbs, Miss Theima Olsen, Miss Edith Little, Miss Amy Little, Miss Ruth Little, Miss Margaret Little, Miss Theima Mist and Miss Frances Dover.

The pallbearers were also classmates of Margaret at the local high school and included Gordon Little, Norman Chapman, Kenneth At-ree, W. Cooper, G. Haugland, A. Haugland and H. Warden.

Following the ceremony the body was taken to Mountain View Cemetery where, amid the encircling snow-capped mountains, she was left at her last resting place.

Miss Kenney will be greatly missed in the community. One of the most popular of the younger set, she was active in the Young People's Society and her deep love for the younger children drew her to be a very active worker in Knox United Church Sunday School.

A profusion of flowers spoke high tribute of the respect with which she has been held in the community, and many expressions of the deep sympathy of the district as a whole have been made known to the bereaved family.

Members of Tsimpsaan and Tye Lodges, A. F. & A. M., escorted the body to the train at Prince Rupert Friday evening.

Little Vera Leighton, after having been a patient in the Prince Rupert General Hospital for six months, left Saturday on her return to her home at Metlakatla.

WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

Southbound from Skagway to Vancouver on a regularly scheduled voyage, C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, arrived in port at 3:45 yesterday afternoon from Alaska and sailed at 5 p.m. for the south. The vessel had on board in all 127 passengers of whom 17 disembarked at this port. Sixteen took passage on her here for Vancouver.

With a fair-sized list of passengers, Union steamer Catala, Capt. James Findlay, arrived in port at 7 o'clock last evening from the south and sailed a couple of hours later for Stewart, Anxox and other northern points whence she is scheduled to call here southbound tomorrow afternoon.

Halibut landings at the port of Seattle last week totalled 514,000 pounds. On Saturday two boats sold at the Puget Sound port as follows: Venture, 32,000, Sebastian, 11 1/4 and 10c; Havana, 35,000, Washington, 11 1/4 and 10 1/4. The Presho sold 13,000 pounds of sablefish to San Juan at 4c.

Discharging seven carloads of frozen fish from Ketchikan for trans-shipment east over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s steamer North Sea, Capt. A. W. Nickerson, was here all night Saturday. The vessel arrived at 8 p.m. from Alaska and sailed at 5 a.m. Sunday in continuation of her voyage to Seattle.

Imperial Oil Co.'s tanker Imperial, Capt. A. S. McGaw, arrived in port at 8:30 this morning from Ioco with fuel cargo for the company's local tanks and, after discharging, will sail on her return south.

Edward Forsman Died Saturday

Former Anxox Miner Had Been Engaged in More Recent Years As Miner Here

Edward John Forsman, who worked as a miner at Anxox for 15 years and had been engaged in fishing here for some four or five years, passed away late Saturday morning in the Prince Rupert General Hospital where he had been a patient for some time. He was 58 years of age and, born in Sweden, was a naturalized Canadian. He had lived in Canada for 30 years. During the Great War he served in France with the First Pioneers. In 1930 deceased was injured in a cave-in at the Anxox mine and had since been in Prince Rupert, having taken up fishing. Mr. Forsman was
