MR. DUNNING'S WEAK POINT

The weakness in the Dunning scheme to compel provinces needing federal aid to hand over control of their UD finances is that the federal government is as anxious as are the provinces themselves that not one of them shall North default. If there were a bankrupt province, it would cripple all provinces.

The western provinces, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, are important markets for the manufacturers of Quebec and Ontario. They seem to be necessary evils. They are in something the same position as the unemployed in Vancouver who are mostly! people who have come in from the surrounding districts! and spent their money in the city and then they ask the city to keep them. Without these outside people, now on relief, the city would be crippled. Without the western provinces the provinces of Ontario and Quebec would be seriously crippled. We are necessary to Ottawa and so is our credit and good name necessary to Dominion credit.

So we, the western provinces, go to Ottawa in time of stress and say: "You have sold us your goods. You have sucked us dry with the prices you charge in a protected market. You have built up your businesses at our expense. So now you must do something to help us. We do not come The Economy Store to you as suppliants but as members of the same family. to you as suppliants but as members of the same family who have a right to ask payment for what we do for the rest of you."

Premier Aberhart is right when he demands help in his refunding scheme and in asking loans so that the province of Alberta may pay its debt.
