In connection with the twenty-first anniversary of the founding of the University of British Columbia, there has just been issued a very handsome brochure, well printed and finely illustrated, of the history and scope of the university.

The illustrations convey even better than the descriptions, an idea of what the buildings look like, inside and out and what the site was like prior to the commencement of operations at Point Grey.

It is evident that the university has become in the twenty-one years of its existence one of the outstanding British Columbia institutions and one of which every resident in the province may be proud. The record of its students has been good and has exercised a powerful influence on the life of this and other Canadian provinces.
