GREETINGS CONVEYED

Western Canada Expresses Good Wish to 100-Year Old Railway

WINNIPEG, July 23.—Western Canada expressed its good wishes and anniversary greetings in a big way when civic officials of nearly every city and important town wired to President S. J. Hungerford of the Canadian National Railways, congratulating the system upon the celebration of its one-hundredth birthday. These messages were in addition to those which poured in from Eastern Canada civic and business dignitaries alike.

Mayor Cragg of Halifax and Mayor David Leeming of Victoria brought the eastern and western shores of Canada together with their messages of felicitation. In addition to Mayor Leeming of Victoria, the Kiwanis Club of that city, after listening to an address on the railway centenary, sent off a message of good wishes to President Hungerford. Mayor Leeming said in part, "may your ribbons of steel continue to carry prosperity to our Dominion in years to come and we hope Canadian National service will remain stamped with the hallmark of efficiency, and quality."

Hon. Harcourt Malcolm K.C., Speaker of the Assembly in the Bahamas, who, with Mrs. Malcolm, is visiting Winnipeg, wired best wishes for the continued success of so historic an institution.

Tom Reid, M.P., wired from New Westminster the hope the railways will make as large a contribution in the future as they have the first hundred years.

Mayor John Queen, Winnipeg, wired congratulations: "As the first hundred years are the hardest, hope your troubles are all behind you and you continue to make progress which means the success of Canada."

C. E. Stockhill, president of the

Winnipeg Board of Trade, and A. Searle Leach, president of the Young Men's Section, both contributed inspiring messages of good will.


