THE WORRYING WOMAN

Worst Kind of Way to Make Life Not Worth While is to Worry.

A woman who never worries declares that there is nothing more detrimental to beauty in woman than worry. The worrying woman does nobody any good. She simply invites the hand of Time, which writes plenty of wrinkles on her brow, around her eyes and mouth, paints her face a yellow, and gives her lack-lustre eyes that no artifice can brighten. It is quite unnecessary to worry, and it is a total waste of energy which can be better employed in doing something useful. The man who wrote (it must have been a man) "It is not work but worry that kills," knew something. He had a wife, or a sister or a cousin or an aunt who worried him by inches, and so killed him by inches. That is the worst of a worrying woman. She not only worries, but she worries you.

Braised Beef

When selecting beef for braising choose a thick square piece from some of the cheaper cuts, such as the shoulder or cross rib. It should be first browned quickly in a little suet melted in a pan, laid on a bed of sliced vegetables—preferably onions and carrots—such seasoning added as is desired and about a pint of either boiling stock, water, stewed tomato or brown gravy poured round. It is then closely covered and cooked in a moderate oven, allowing forty minutes to the pound.

Buttermilk Bread

Use buttermilk which is not too sour. Heat a quart of it to the boiling point, stirring frequently to prevent curdling. Add one tablespoonful of sugar, set aside for five minutes and mix gradually with one quart of sifted flour, beating and stirring until a smooth batter is made. Cover closely and let stand over night. Then add to the batter one teaspoonful of baking soda dissolved in one quarter of a cupful of hot water, one scant tablespoonful of salt and two tablespoonfuls of melted butter or shortening. Beat well, then gradually sift and mix in sufficient flour to make a soft dough. Turn out on a well floured board and knead until very soft and velvety to the touch. Divide into thirds, mold into loaves, place in greased pans and bake at once in a moderate oven.

The Art of Carving

Carving was once a serious thing. The Sixteenth Century carver was a professional. He had to make the joint fit the guest. The size of his slices was the thing. Then he had to know his guests and cut accordingly. A lord, for instance, at the table, and a pike was dished up whole. Smaller fry, and the pike came on in slices. The same procedure with the pig. The rank of the diners decided whether it should appear at table in gold leaf or naked, whole or sliced. With bread, too, there was a difference. New, or three days old baked, was at the discretion of the carver as he sized up the visitors. And as for the apportioning of the tid-bits according to precedence there was no end. The old time carver, in fact, was born and then made.

CONGRESS OF FARM WOMEN
Event of Importance to Women Agriculturalists—First Ever Held.

The first international congress of farm women opens in Colorado Springs on October 17. The committee in charge have agreed upon the general outlines of the program as follows: First day, equipment and beauty of, and food

values in rural homes; second day, laws of physical life in relation to the family, conservation of time and strength, labor saving devices and simple hygiene, etc.; third day, economic value of women and children on the farm, influence of clubs, granges and other agricultural associations, care of infants and young children, etc.; fourth day, the rural church, reorganization of rural schools, recreation in the rural districts, etc. Each general topic is broken into many subjects, and there will be demonstrations by the Colorado Agricultural College domestic science department and the department of agriculture, showing the menace of the house fly and exhibitions and illustrations by other speakers.

Among the noted speakers on the program will be Prof. W. M. Hays, assistant secretary of agriculture, an authority on rural school work; Rev. Warren H. Wilson of New York, famous worker in rural church; Mrs. Mary Pierce Van Zile, of Kansas Agricultural College; Mrs. J. A. Widstoe of Utah Agricultural College; Mrs. Scott Durand, of Lake Forest, Ill.; Miss Jennie Buell, grange lecturer, of Ann Arbor Mich.; Mrs. F. E. Brooks, of Colorado Springs, and others.

Practical farm women from through out the entire country will attend.
