BONDING OF MINE

Silver Pick Property on Sabine Mountain Leased by Grand Forks Men

SMITHERS, Oct. 2.—The Silver Pick mining property on Sabine Mountain was recently given over on a working bond and lease by the owners, Thos. King and Martin Cain of Smithers, to J. J. Herman and associates of Grand Forks.

Mr. Herman and his partners lost no time in getting on to the property and they are now busily engaged with a small crew producing high grade ore for shipment to the smelter.

A small amount of work is being done on the Cronin Mine road over which the ore will be transported in order to put the road in good shape for the winter, this work being done by the Department of Public Works and being greatly appreciated by the mine operators.

The government is showing willingness to co-operate with small producers and in assisting them by keeping the roads and trails open as it means a very great deal to those undertaking work in a small way and who are developing properties that might easily turn into big producers at some future date.

A small shipment of ore was made from this property in 1935 by the owners which netted them over \$150 per ton after paying charges of transportation and smelting of over \$60 per ton.
