CLOTHIERS' EASY WIN

Lambie & Stone Put on Great Hoop Display to Beat Grotto

Jumping into a quick 8-0 lead in the first two minutes of play, the "Three Basketeers" of the Clothiers—Lindsay, Calderoni and Santerbane—dropped in shot after shot to culminate some pretty combination and give Lambie and Stone a 27 to 9 lead at the interval. The second half was merely a repetition of what had gone before as the Clothiers, playing a five man defense, bottled up the whole tobaccoist crew and still continued to snare their quota of counters. Twelve minutes from time the score stood 43-13. Up to this time "Legs" MacPhee had been limited to one free throw but now he began to sink them from all angles while his team-mates—"Hooker" Morgan and "Bad Man" Stalker—garnered the occasional tally. With five minutes to go, the Clothiers again turned on the steam and breezed home with a more than comfortable margin, 51 to 32, at the final whistle.
