## MAKE ARMS

This is Hope of Premier Baldwin -All Dominions Anxious About Defences

LONDON, Nov. 13: (CP)-Prime Minister Stanley Baldwin, replying in the House of Commons yesterday to criticism of the government's defence policy, expressed hope that steps could be taken toward using Canada's resources for manufacture of armaments in the Dominion.

Mr. Baldwin added that "all Dominions, anxious about world politics, are discussing armaments with us."
