STIRRING MESSAGE

Visiting British-Israel Speaker Heard at Meeting Last Night

Rev. F. W. Dafoe presided at the British-Israel meeting last night in the Baptist Church when Lieut. Col. L. G. Wright of Vancouver brought a startling message of inspiration to a capacity audience.

Opening his address with greetings from the Vancouver Association to the Prince Rupert group, Col. Wright intimated that, in future, greater co-operation would be effected between these two points and that speakers would more frequently visit this city from this time. He spoke of the growth of the movement which boasts over 250 publications promoting its beliefs.

In a forceful manner, Col. Wright traced the purposes of God concerning Israel and the marvelous fulfilment of all that is written in the Bible concerning them.

Basing his address on II Samuel 7-10, Col. Wright declared the "Appointed Place" referred to in this text was the Isles of the Sea northwest of Palestine as mentioned by the prophet Jeremiah. In a pleasing manner he explained the Sabbath law of God and said that the Anglo-Saxons were the only people who observed "his day (Sabbath)." "This fact is but one mark of identification, that we are Israel."

Bible's Veracity

The speaker referred to the Great Pyramid, pointing out that this structure was a witness to the veracity of the Bible. British-Israel truth was founded not on the Pyramid but on the Bible. The dating of the Pyramid had fully testified to the truth of the Bible and the history of Israel. We shall look back and find out that September 16 was the beginning of a new condition of things among the Israel nations.

The speaker traced the movement and history of Israel from the time of David to the present day and urged his hearers to reread the Bible in the light of British-Israel truth.

Closing his address with the declaration that "our people must ultimately come to the place where a national repentance and turning to God will eventuate," Col. Wright urged his hearers to seriously consider the claims of God and His Christ.

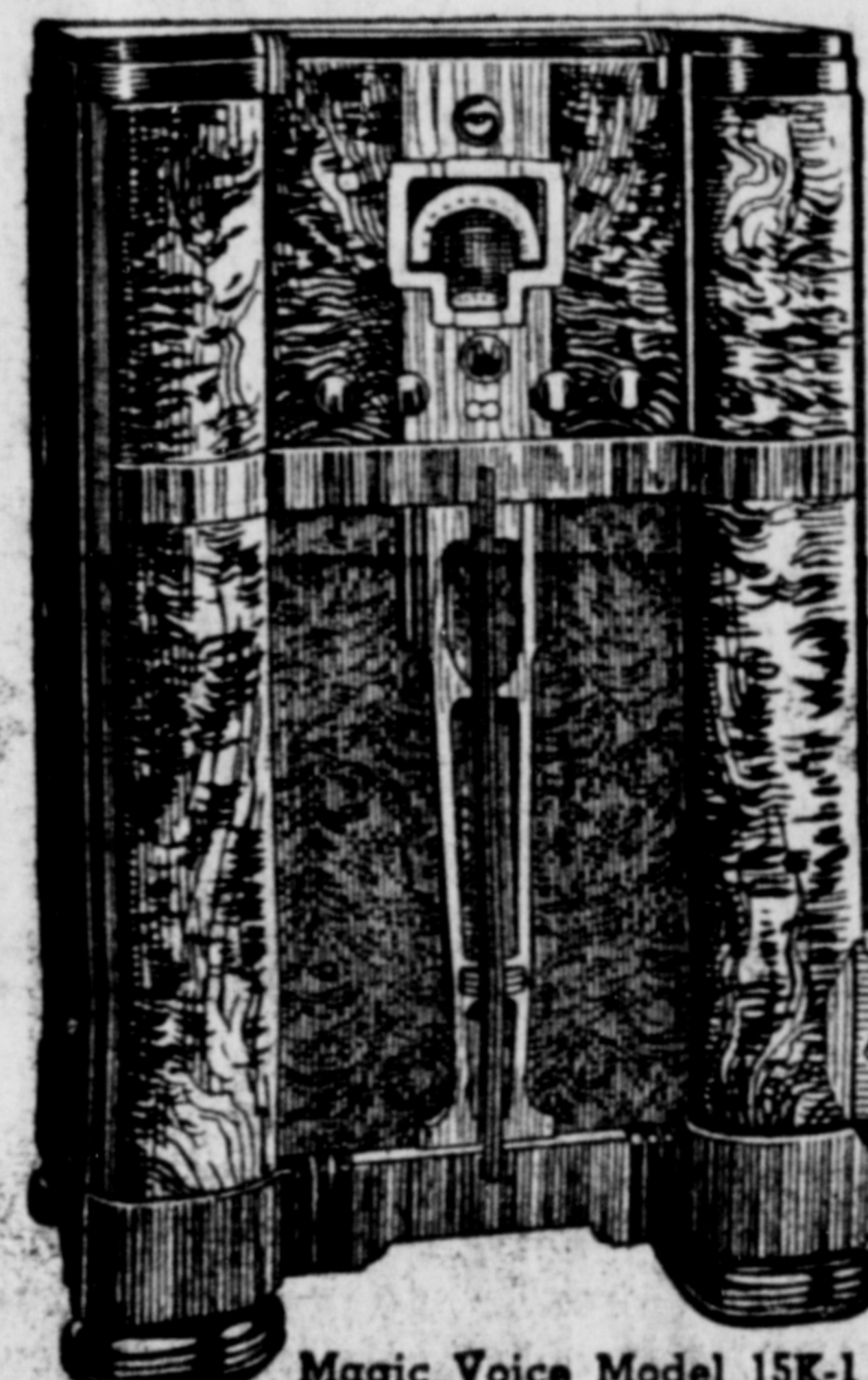
