part to limit Germany's re-arming. However, there had been no success in an air treaty, Hitler insisting on air supremacy.
 No nation in Europe could forget the enormous power of the German Army during the Great War and the capacity of the German people to support it. Today saw practically all the other powers of Europe forming alliances in fear of another German drive. To meet these alliances, Germany had so far, apparently, done little except for the alliance with Poland. Now, it was believed that Germany was attempting to ally herself with Hungary. The latest rumor, and one that seemed to be quite reasonable in view of their mutual hatred of Russia at whose expense both sought to expand was that Germany was angling for an alliance with Japan.
