Italo-Ethiopian Crisis Is Insignificant as Compared With Hitler's Action Today

GENEVA, March 7: (CP)-League of Nations circles declared today that Adolf Hitler's denunciation of the Locarno Treaty has precipitated a grave international crisis which makes the Italo-Ethiopian war insignificant in comparison.

League officials predicted an early extraordinary session of the council, possibly together with the assembly, in a great world peace conference called in an attempt to draft a substitute for the Versailles as well as the Locarno Treaty.
