All of the children in the city elementary and high schools. 353 in number, were examined a qualified dentist to discover the extent of dental defects and it was found that 94.5 percent of the number required dental treatment. Cavities were found in the teeth of 96.16 percent of the pupils and the average number of cavities per child was 5.3.

"This percentage of defects is very high and would not obtain in all schools." said Dr. Weir "but I think it gives a very good idea of the dental defects existing among the children of British Col-
