Timely Recipes

VANILLA ICE CREAM

Automatic Refrigerator Method
Two-thirds cup sweetened condensed milk, 1/2 cup water, 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla, 1 cup whipping cream.

Blend thoroughly sweetened condensed milk, water and vanilla. Chill. Whip cream to custard-like consistency and fold into chilled mixture. Pour into freezing pan. Place in freezing unit. After mixture has frozen to a stiff mush (1 to 2 hours) remove from refrigerator. Scrape mixture from sides and bottom of pan. Beat two minutes. Smooth out and replace in freezing unit for one hour or until frozen for serving. (Two to five hours, total freezing time.) Serves six.

BANANA ICE CREAM

Freezer Method

One and one-third cups (1 can) sweetened condensed milk, 2 cups thin cream, 1 cup cold water, 1 teaspoon lemon extract, 3 bananas, mashed to pulp.

Thoroughly blend sweetened condensed milk, thin cream, cold water and lemon extract. Freeze in two-quart freezer. Remove dasher. Add mashed bananas. Pack in ice and salt for one hour or more after freezing. Makes one and one-half quarts.

If you want to be certain that each guest has the time of his life; that refreshments will be found perfect and that you yourself will have a lot of fun, invite children to a party! Every youngster should occasionally have the pleasure and training of being host or hostess to little friends. It's a rare child who is bored at a party and a still rarer one who will not let you know about it pretty promptly so that something can be done about it. Three or four little friends together are enough for a good time, but—feed them! And give them things to which their mothers are not likely to have objections.

Vanilla or fruit ice cream is an excellent choice, for ice cream is as healthful as it is delicious. You can decorate each serving with a procession of animal crackers marching across it or with a "funny face" made with raisins for eyes, a bit of cherry or red apple for the mouth, orange peel ears and a hat made by setting a marshmallow on a vanilla wafer and sticking a toothpick through both to rest on the ice cream man's head.

Small cup cakes will be greeted with exclamations of glee. Frost them pleasingly or hollow out and fill with a delicious, rich, custardy filling. Then cover again and frost. They're a delicacy.

They'll like hot cocoa or chocolate malted milk, especially if you float a marshmallow or dab of whipped cream on it.

PROBING DISASTER

Cause of Mid-Air Crash at Honolulu May Never be Known

HONOLULU, Jan. 28.—A United States Army board of inquiry has been formed to conduct an investigation into the collision of two bombing planes at an altitude of 1100 feet over Luke Field here Friday when one officer and five enlisted men were killed. The task of determining the cause of the mid-air crash is, however, considered virtually hopeless, so little having been left of either of the planes after they plunged to the ground in flames. Two men who made their escape in parachutes can, apparently, throw little light upon the circumstances of the disaster, the exact cause of which will probably never be ascertained.

AL SMITH IS HEARD

Former New York Governor Again Attacks New Deal

NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—Speaking before the American Liberty League here, Former Governor Al Smith of New York, after declaring that he had no aspirations for office in the presidential election campaign this year or intended to take part in any way in the campaign, criticized the New Deal and charged the Roosevelt administration with having failed to make good its promises of 1932. Instead of working along true Democratic lines, it had been a demagogic administration of compromise and had incited one class against another. Declaring that he himself represented the one great class of the rank and file, Smith asserted that capital and labor must go hand in hand if prosperity was to be restored to the land.
