Clear across the main channel of the river from Point Lambert to De Horsey Island there is a great ice barrier, possibly a mile across and three or four feet in height, which completely blocks steamers from getting into the river. The steamer Venture attempted to break through last week but failed. She did not try yesterday. Above this, the ice is loose and drifting in huge floes back and forth with the tides. Further up the river at Telegraph Point it is possible to cross the river on the ice. Five miles above Port Essington the Ecstall River is frozen fro; shore to shore. The slough is completely choked up! with drift ice. Big tides due soon. it is expected, will effectively break. up the ice in the lower Skeena. even should the weather fail to moderate. On account of the damage done by the ice, considerable repair work to cannery wharves and floats will be necessary in the spring.
