Alberta Sweep Winner Deluged With Letters From Persons Seeking Financial Help

EDMONTON, Dec. 9: (CP)-When Dan Bulger galloped home first in the Cambridgeshire Stakes at Newmarket on October 28, he brought Walter Snowden \$85,000 on a sweepstake ticket and started a flood of letters towards the Snowden farm from people wishing to share his good fortune.

From all over Canada and the United States, hundred of persons have written the Rochfort Bridge agrarian telling him how he could help them financially. Books of lottery tickets have come from Ireland, Queensland, Australia, France, Italy, the United States and various points in the Domin-

ning in answer to the Royal sumions, presumably to receive the nal decision of the King, on reunciation of either his Throne or Ars. Simpson. The Premier hasened over icy roads from London an hour and fifteen minutes to nter the gates of the royal resience in the gathering darkness.

It was generally believed that he decision, even if it were given Fort Belvedere, would be witheld from the public until Premier aldwin had the opportunity to mmunicate it to the House of commons. Particularly would this so if the answer was abdication. he King, of course, might give the ip-off by quick departure from he country.

The King's younger brother, who rove alone to Fort Belvedere this orning, was believed to have paricipated in tonight's crucial conference. There were also reports hat the motor of the Duke of ork, heir-presumptive, had been seen entering the side entrance of the estate.

Those who expected the King to ive the Prime Minister his final word tonight pointed out that every day's delay was costing thouands of pounds. Vast business, pased on the coronation next May was at a standstill.
