"I know that I will be killed if I keep up flying long enough. None of us birdsmen and birds-women have a guaranteed lease on life, assuring us that we will not fall out of the clouds, get tangled in the wires of our aeroplanes and come back to mother earth with a thud that will shatter every bone in our bodies."

"Down in my heart I often question myself whether I did right in adopting this flying business as my own. That is not caused, however, by any fear that some horrible accident stares me in the face every time I ascend into the clouds, but it is when I wonder what my little boy would do when I meet the inevitable end of all aviators who cling to the game."

"Only the other day the little fellow looked up in my face and said: 'Mamma, what would become of me if you should get killed like papa?' I told him that God would take care of me, and that He would watch over me all the more if my little boy would say a prayer for me every time I fly."

"Some time, and soon, both of us hope, I will have saved enough money to retire from the dangerous business, and then not all the gold in the world would tempt me to continue taking chances of making my boy an orphan. It is enough that aviation claimed his father."
