SPEAKERS FAVOR COMMISSION GOV.

(Continued from Page One)

Cambridge, U. S. A., remarked that there politics in municipal affairs had a bad effect. "Our firemen and policemen," he said, "are amongst the best politicians we have," (laughter). "An alderman," he said later, "is a man who goes down to the city hall, and sits around and passes on things in a general sort of way." (Laughter and cheers).

"Do away with party designations," said another new speaker. "They have nothing to do with municipal government. The people want a city run for them so they can have a chance to get around and hustle." (Cheers).

Asked a Question

Rev. F. W. Kerr asked what guarantee there was that under commission government any better men would hold office than under council. A speaker suggested the decision of the majority in a community for any particular commission ensured his being the right man.

Alex Manson maintained that the commission system did mean that better men were put in charge of the city's affairs. He roundly condemned the introduction of party politics into municipal affairs saying that the criminal code should be framed so as to impose a penalty of six months' imprisonment without the option—on any man introducing party politics into municipal affairs. (Laughter and cheers).

Some Repartee

A little later in the discussion W. H. Montgomery boldly declared that he believed "the speaker who would have six months' penalty imposed on party politicians coming into municipal affairs would be the first to deserve that penalty along with many others of like profession."

A young Scotchman from Glasgow aroused considerable attention and applause by his enthusiasm over the good government of Glasgow. "Educate your people," he said. "Then they will be able to insist on good government."

Others Spoke

Other speakers during the evening who contributed to the discussion were W. P. Lynch whose reply to the idea that Canadian municipal commissioners would be like Canadian judges, above suspicion, was that Canadian judges don't have to face the polls; and Alderman Clayton who came in late and gave an eloquent resume of the origin of commission government with remarks in a general way bearing on the subject, and some criticism of the young speakers from the States.

At the end of the discussion the Mayor hoped that other meetings under the same auspices would be held on the same subject. A programme of songs by some of the well known talent of the Presbyterian church came in well at the opening and close of the discussion, and songs were given during the intervals.
