All nations ex- Moose cept the United States have been in the habit of making treaties of various kinds with other nations, often secret arrangements or agreements, and using the worst kind of deception and duplicity, reminding one rather of an old time horse deal than of a solemn contract between leading nations.

Britain has done her part in this old diplomatic policy. Possibly she had been forced to do it to keep even with the rest of the world and, not unlikely, she has been just as bad as the worst of them. At a time when duplicity was considered a merit, nothing better could be expected.

Today we are realizing that nations should be honest with each other, just as much as business people are honest in their dealings with each other. It is an ideal toward which the world is striving and it is up to civilized na- cowan & Latta.


