Waterfront Whiffs

Framework For Addition to Cold Storage Plant Taking Shape—Fisheries Commission Sitting—Alaska Passenger Traffic

Framework of the new addition to the plant of the Northern Fishermen's Cold Storage Co. on the local waterfront is now beginning to take shape. Following completion of the excavation and concrete foundations, heavy timbers of the superstructure are now being erected. Work is going ahead steadily and the new unit, situated just across the road from the main plant and adjoining the railway track, will be ready for use by the opening of the new fishing season.

Lateness of last night's train in arriving caused further postponement from last evening until this afternoon of the public hearing of the International Fisheries Commission. Members of the commission arrived in the city on the train. Conferences are also being held by the commissioners while here with various branches of the industry to hear their views on problems affecting the halibut fishery.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah, Capt. William Palmer, which was in port yesterday afternoon southbound from Skagway to Vancouver, was crowded to capacity with no less than 215 passengers. The list included a number of White Pass & Yukon Route employees going south for the winter but the majority of the passengers were Alaskans who were unable to go south on the American ships owing to the maritime workers' strike. Fifteen persons disembarked from the Princess Norah here including some who continued south on the Princess Adelaide this morning.

After making a special run overnight to Ketchikan to pick up some one hundred passengers for Seattle, C. P. R. steamer Princess Adelaide, Capt. Henry Anderson, returned here at 9 o'clock this morning and sailed later for Vancouver and waypoints.

Making a special voyage north to handle passenger traffic arising at Alaska points owing to the continued maritime workers' strike which is tying up American steamship services, C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise is due here next Wednesday morning from Vancouver enroute to Skagway.
