## CHIENG KAI SHEK NOW REPORTED DEAD Edward's Love Affair

## Serious Implications Are Seen in Latest Crisis in Far East

Present Situation is Very Tense and Bears All The Portent of Civil War Which May Involve Both Japan and Russia

NANKING, Dec. 14:-Despite earlier denials, the hinese Nationalist government now admits that Gen-Chiang Kai Shek, Premier and war lord, is being eld by mutinous communist-inclined forces under Marshal Chang Hsaio Liang at Sianfu. Unless the demand for declaration of war against Japan is acceded to, capfors of Chiang Kai Shek refuse to guarantee his safety. A report from Peiping last night said he had already been slain. The present situation is very tense and bears Il the portents of civil war which may involve both Rusia and Japan.
