The iceberg season on the North Atlantic is starting much earlier than usual this year. Reports from Cape Race, Nfld., state that a huge 'berg, 700 feet long and 200 feet high, was sighted by the Swedish motorship Sorvard. Such an iceberg must be of tremendous proportions when it is recalled that only about one-ninth appears above the surface of the water. Icebergs constitute a grave source of peril to Atlantic shipping, and by international ag eement, the North Atlantic is patrolled by special lookout sh.ps to guard shipping lanes.
