B. C. Has Million Dollar Surplus -No Default or Repudiation

TORONTO, Dec. 17: (CP)-British Columbia will have surplus of close to \$1,000,000 at the end of the present fiscal year besides having reduced the debenture debt by \$5,858,000, Hon. John Hart, British Columbia minister of finance, said here yesterday.

Mr. Hart, on his way west after attending a financial conference in Ottawa, said there would be no default and no repudiation of British Columbia securities. The extent and cost of relief has now been so reduced it is planned expenditure next year out of cur-

rent revenue. In the past three years indusincreased by nearly \$36,000,000. Tourist business was up \$65,000,-000 and the production of the four leading industries had advanced from \$116,900,000 to \$179, 435,000 annually, said Mr. Hart.
