

Simmons, whose streak was broken in 1935, performed the feat again last season for a lifetime total of 12, within one of Babe Ruth's all-time high of 13. Meantime, Goose Goslin brought his total to 11 by scoring! 125 mates. The threat to a Ruthian record was bettered by Gehrig, who drove in over 150 runs for the sixth time in his career, tying the Babe's mark.
