Terrace Unable to Get Strawberries To Market-Cherries There Also Ripening Early

Southern strawberries are about over on the local retail market, no good shippers being available. The strawberry season at Terrace is well advanced but, owing to the railway tie-up, it is impossible to get supplies from that district. It is thought, however, that some may get through later.

Terrace cherries are also about ready for picking now and they

will be needing transportation. California Elberta peaches arrived on the local produce market today as did also preserving apricots. Those desiring preserving apricots are being advised not to delay buying as there is only a twenty percent crop in the Okanagan, which sends most of its output to the prairies, and there is also a short season in the Wenatchee Valley. The pirce is \$1.45 per crate.

The selection of vegetables is becoming wider with fresh peas and beans, at reasonable prices, among the new lines.






