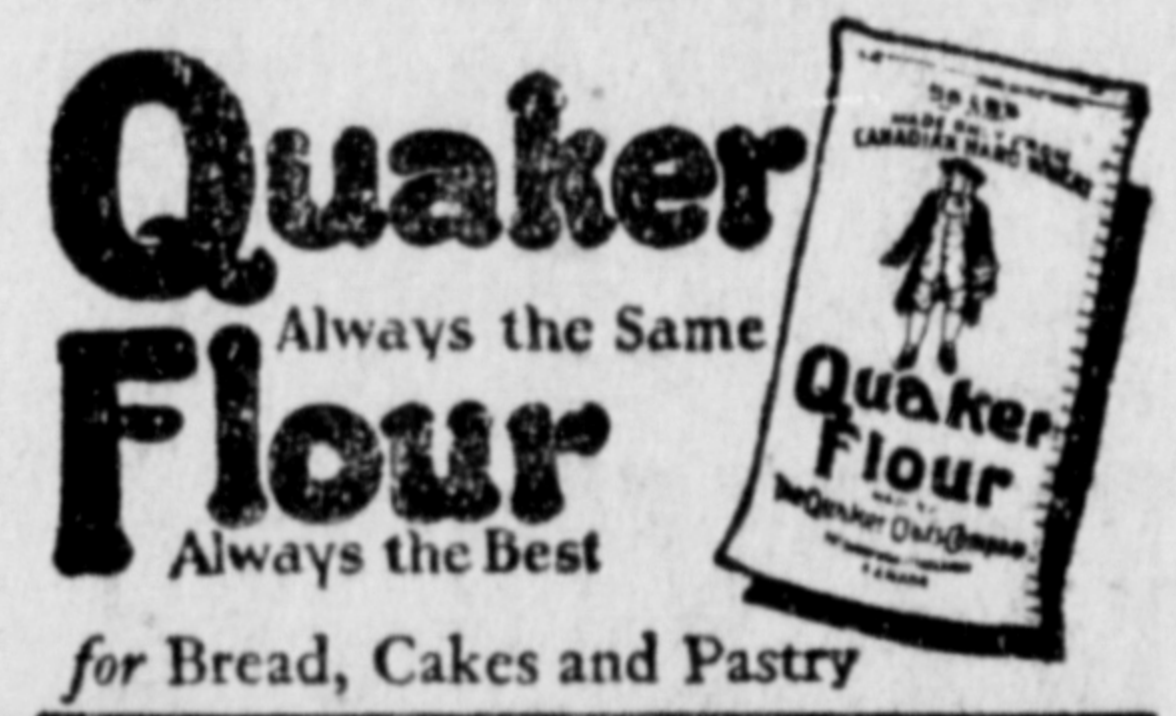

WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

With a fair-sized list of passengers, C.N.R. steamer Prince Rupert, with Capt. H. E. Nedden in command after having been ashore in Vancouver on annual vacation, arrived in port at 10.15 this morning from Vancouver. Powell River and Ocean Falls and sails at 4 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart whence she will return here tomorrow evening southbound. A. H. Robson who during the past summer has been purser of the Prince Robert has now assumed duties for the winter as purser of the Prince Rupert.

The British steamer Dunelmia loading a cargo of 500,000 feet of cottonwood logs at the lumber assembly wharf here for delivery to China, is expected to be ready to sail tomorrow for Shanghai.

Only one catch of halibut was sold at Seattle yesterday. This was the 43,000 pound fare of the schooner Omaney which was purchased by the San Juan Fisheries for 12c and 11.5c.

The well known Shumagin Island trading vessel Blue Fox, sixty feet long, is now in Seattle undergoing an overhaul on completion of which she will sail on her return north.
